## Charter and Purpose

Created by Executive Order No. 00-31, the New Mexico State Employees Charities Campaign (NMSECC) is **the only annual fundraising campaign enabling state employees to make contributions to charitable organizations through payroll deductions**. NMSECC was created to:

- A. *Provide* an opportunity for employees to contribute to qualified non-profit organizations through contributions and, the State's voluntary payroll deduction process;
- B. *Facilitate* and support existing volunteer not-for-profit service agencies operating within the State of New Mexico that provide significant benefits to New Mexico residents; and
- C. *Ensure* accountability to participants in regard to the funds so raised.

## Selection of Agencies

The Executive Charitable Order specifies that NMSECC supports "Voluntary Not-For-Profit Service Organizations" and lays out criteria that agencies must satisfy in order to participate. Besides being recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a tax-exempt organization under 26 U.S.C. §501(c)(3) or §170, there are a dozen other criteria the agency must meet to participate in NMSECC. Some of the criteria are normal "due diligence" requirements—non-discrimination in service delivery and hiring, accounting for funds in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, having an annual audit, etc. Other criteria are specific to the NMSECC charter. Some of these are:

- The agency must "have a direct and substantial local presence" in New Mexico.
- The board of directors that governs its affairs must have a majority of volunteers who reside in New Mexico.

## The Campaign

The annual NMSECC campaign kicks off each year. All contributions are voluntary and individuals have the option of disclosing their contribution or keeping it confidential. Individuals may contribute through personal pledges, special events or any other form of fund raising they are comfortable with. The Department of Health is the fiscal agency for NMSECC and the work of the NMSECC Coordinator is subject to audit.

## Distribution of Funds

Payroll deductions will begin in May of 2012. The deductions will run through the end of December of 2012. Funds are distributed annually as soon as possible after they are collected. Reports are available that list all the recipient agencies and the amount each receives from the campaign.

## Making a Contribution

Contributions may be a one-time contribution or pledges redeemed through payroll deduction. When you choose an agency to which you would like to contribute, make sure that you include the Agency ID number for your record of contribution. *Contributions are non-refundable.*
